Brought to you by Alcoholics Anonymous World Services, Inc., Meeting Guide is a free of charge meeting finder app for iOS and Android that provides meeting information from A.A. service entities in an easy-toaccess format

Meeting Guide syncs with area, district, intergroup/ central offices and international General Service Office websites (some of which are listed on A.A. Near You), relaying meeting information from more than 300 A.A. service entities directly to you. Over 100,000 weekly meetings are currently listed, and the information is refreshed twice daily.

This app gives A.A. service entities full control of their local meeting information while collecting it in one place, making it easy for anyone to find a meeting. Local entities provide their meeting information voluntarily. Meeting Guide users can suggest additions or corrections to meeting listings by using links provided within the app to contact the local service entity responsible for the information.

New & Enhanced Features

Search — Find A.A meetings by name or location, in addition to day and time

Daily Reflections — a selection of reflections by and for A.A. members

Enhanced location functionality -Expanded user interface, with a new menu bar and "Contact" feature.

"News" — Learn about events at the General Service Office (G.S.O.) and Grapevine, as well as information about updates within the app.







Area 64 Assembly

October 4-6, 2019

To conduct its business, Area 64 meets in assembly four times per year. Each assembly consists of elected officers, district committee members (DCMs), individual group service representatives (GSRs) and the chairpersons of several standing committees.

Area 64's standing committee structure is closely aligned to that of the General Service Conference committee structure.

In assembly, reports are heard and area affairs are discussed.

Who may attend and vote?

All A.A. members are welcome, but only those elected or appointed as a District Committee Member (DCM), General Service Representative (GSR), Officers/Alternate Officers, past Delegates, and Area Standing Committee Chairs may cast a vote.

Chair

The chairperson is responsible for the smooth running of area assemblies, consulting with the committee before setting the date and time, making sure that all groups are notified, consulting with officers and committee members on the program, and chairing the assembly meetings. The chairperson, more than any other officer, keeps the delegate informed about what is going on in the area, and makes sure that committee members are aware of what goes on in world services.

Corresponding Secretary

The corresponding secretary communicates between the A.A. General Service Office and area groups making sure the group schedules, meeting places and other information is up to date. Group representatives may contact either the corresponding secretary or Webmaster to update schedules and/or A.A. meeting times and information.

Delegate

Though the high point is the Conference meeting, the delegate's job goes on year-round and involves all aspects of the Conference structure. 1) The delegate attends the annual Conference and communicates the actions of the Conference to area committee members. 2) Is prepared to attend all area and regional service meetings and assemblies applicable to his/her respective area. 3) Helps area committees obtain financial support for the area and G.S.O. 4) Provides leadership in solving local problems involving the A.A. Traditions and cooperates with G.S.O. in obtaining information. 5) Works closely with committee members and officers, sharing experience throughout the year.

Recording Secretary

The secretary records and distributes minutes of area meetings, keeps mailing lists up to date, and sends out area mailings. Sometimes the secretary is responsible for preparing lively bulletins that will encourage attendance at committee meetings and assemblies. The secretary is in a good position to act as liaison between officers and committee members.

Treasurer

The treasurer keeps financial records for the area and reports regularly to the assembly. In most cases, the treasurer is responsible for encouraging contribution support for area and G.S.O. services.

A DAILY REPRIEVE

There is more to the solution to our alcoholism, than just stopping drinking.

Just stopping, is only the first step away from the problem, and only PART of the first step to the solution. A definition for recovering says these things will disappear when there is spiritual understanding. Now, let's read the definition of recovered. Let's take a very close look at what it means to be a recovered alcoholic.

There are eighteen points to consider. Go to the bottom of Page 84, last paragraph:

- 1) And we have ceased fighting anything or anyone even alcohol.
- 2) For by this time sanity will have returned.
- 3) We will seldom be interested in liquor.
- 4) If tempted, we recoil from it as from a hot flame.
- 5) We react sanely and normally,
- 6) and we will find that this has happened

automatically.

- 7) We will see that our new attitude toward liquor has been given us without any thought or effort on our part. It just comes! That is the miracle of it.
- 8) We are not fighting it, neither are we avoiding temptation.
- 9) We feel as though we had been placed in a position of neutrality safe and protected.
- 10) We have not even sworn off.
- 11) Instead, the problem has been removed.
- 12) It does not exist for us.
- 13) We are neither cocky nor are we afraid.
- 14) That's how we react so long as we keep in fit spiritual condition.
- 15) It is easy to let up on the spiritual program of action and rest on our laurels.
- 16) We are headed for trouble if we do, for alcohol is a subtle foe.
- 17) We are not cured of alcoholism.




